"The vine and the branches"

Spring is here upon us and everything is looking green and bright again. Like the crops, plants, trees and flowers everyday affords us as branches in the vine profound opportunities to bloom and bear more fruits in godliness. As we continually celebrate the joy of his resurrection to new life, may we respond to this sacrificial love with gratitude, trust and love by making sacrifices to help the least of our brothers and sisters. The best way to remain engraved and engrafted in Jesus is by allowing his words to dwell in us, to meditate upon it always and by acting upon it always. The second way is to stay connected to each other as the family tree members of Christ.

As we read from St. John's letter and the Gospel, the image of the vine and the branches used by Jesus serves to describe God's relationship with us. Periodically, he prunes us of our sins and bad habits and trims off our fears often, by the many challenges in our lives in order to bring out the best in us. He corrects our faults that we may produce better fruits in our relationship with him and with one another. Therefore, we must strive to always to remain in Him by keeping his commandments. Like Saul now turning to Paul, this kind of transition always requires fellowship of a faith community built on the consolation and wisdom of the Holy Spirit, nurtured by the true vine and the Father. We need to support each other fed by the living bread, the Eucharist.

Let us share more insights from the *Ecclesia de Eucharistia no.10*

"Unfortunately...there are also shadows. In some places the practice of Eucharistic adoration has been almost completely abandoned. In various parts of the Church abuses have occurred, leading to confusion with regard to sound faith and Catholic doctrine concerning this wonderful sacrament. At times one encounters an extremely reductive understanding of the Eucharistic mystery. Stripped of its sacrificial meaning, it is celebrated as if it were simply a fraternal banquet. Furthermore, the necessity of the ministerial priesthood, grounded in apostolic succession, is at times obscured and the sacramental nature of the Eucharist is reduced to its mere effectiveness as a form of proclamation. This has led here and there to ecumenical initiatives which, albeit well-intentioned, indulge in Eucharistic practices contrary to the discipline by which the Church expresses her faith. How can we not express profound grief at all this? The Eucharist is too great a gift to tolerate ambiguity and depreciation (Ecclesia de Eucharistia, no. 10)."


