# Fr. Summy ... the Pastoris / Pen

### Called to be his presence in the world.

As we celebrate God's unending love in the call of Isaiah the prophet, Peter the apostle and Paul the evangelist, we too are equally called each day to join the urgent apostolic age of the church urging us to go become fishers of men and women. In a world thoroughly broken and truly in need of healing, Jesus is the only solution to our many problems. So, we are all needed and necessary in the divine commission of Matthew 28.16-20 Go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you."

In the same vein, we hear our readings drawing our attention to this same central theme as pilgrims of hope CALLED BY CHRIST TO SAVE ALL HUMANITY. The first reading describes Isaiah's loving response to the same salvific invitation in the vision he had: Here am I, send me. Whenever and in whatever circumstance or whatever age the Lord desires and requires us to volunteer our services to the expansion and building of the kingdom or and to the proclamation of the Good news, the least He expects from us is a complete yes!

A yes, that could alter and change the whole course of our lives. This yes, like the disciples of our Gospel passage in Luke, may include: "they left everything, even their nets, and followed Jesus". What in your own life are you willing to leave, in order to follow Jesus? Tough I guess. For me as a priest, this yes brought me among you, from an 18 hrs long flight away. A journey of two days far from family, friends and the familiar, in order that He may offer me the opportunity of a newer family of faith, you my most cherished parishioners.

I had to shelve my own ambition of reading law and communication to become his priest. A simple yes that was not easy for me 30 years ago in 1995 when I left high school. But, a decision for which I have never regretted making for one day, 20 years after, for this coming July 23<sup>rd</sup> marks my ordination anniversary. It is indeed a huge privilege for me to be a priest of Jesus Christ. With David in the Psalm of today "I will sing your praises Lord before the Angels and before the world "Ps.138. For nothing else gives me greater joy than talking to people about Jesus and talking with Jesus about his people. I just love God passionately and his people compassionately.

None of us is ever worthy to be his representative or the representation of his presence in the world without him. We are called to try and hand on the baton of faith just as apostle Paul did with the Corinthian Church. The faith we have received, intact, undiluted and actively vibrant is the best and greatest gift we can ever hand over to the next generation of Christians, beginning with our children, our youths and young adults. The formation of the laity as the engine room of evangelization program is the invitation I throw to you all this Sunday to come on board.

Dear friends, the absence of these young people, many of them your children and grand or great grand children troubles me a lot, while I pray about it often, I think an investment in technology and media will make an in route to this target audience, because many of these netizens (citizens of the internet) spend a chunk of their time on the social media handles, especially YouTube, Facebook and TikTok among others. We are looking for donors, sponsors and gifted persons of talent and time to journey with me on this mission the Lord has laid upon my heart. With the many gifts buried in us, Christ has turned us into "fishers of men" and we cannot afford to fail him. Do not be afraid he says to us. Let us put out in to the deep waters of the world without fear. Like Peter reassured by the huge miraculous catch, the Lord rewards our little efforts to obedience by the witness of many miracles. No miracle is greater than that of a saved soul, because Jesus came to die just that we may be saved from our sins.

Finally, let also us not be hindered by anything as we respond to the Lord's call this day, we may be filled with fear or unworthiness, but it's not about us, we are just mere servants sent on mission by the Lord of the harvest, and He will be with us all the way. May the Church faithfully and joyfully carry out this mission of preaching the Good news calling all to repentance and new life. Amen
